Minimum coaching qualifications: Recent coaching experience in track at the high school, college, or professional level and experience in recruitment and retention of high school, community college or four-year college/university student athletes. Minimum educational qualifications: Master's Degree in Physical Education preferred **or**, any bachelor's degree and two years full-time experience **or**, any associate degree and six years full-time experience **or**, a valid California Community College Instructor Credential authorizing services as a physical education instructor.

This is an **adjunct assignment** to coach the women's and men's track team, beginning **Fall 2009**. There is also the possibility of teaching physical education classes if you have a Master's Degree in Physical Education or Education with an emphasis in Physical Education or, a Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education and a Master's Degree in Health Education, Recreation Administration or Kinesiology or, the equivalent or, a valid California Community College Instructor Credential authorizing services as a physical education instructor.

Duties include all aspects of planning, directing and coaching the women's and men's track program, including recruiting, budget development, and scheduling.
